It has been a busy week in Ranginui, with swimming lessons making up most of the morning programme. The children are already improving their water skills and are keen to learn more over the next week.

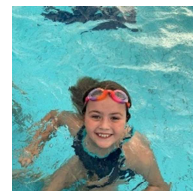

We are continuing our measurement exploration, learning all about weight. We have made our own seesaws and used the balance scales to work out what items are the lightest or heaviest. We are estimating the weight of grocery items and then weighing these on scales, measuring in grams and kilograms. We have learnt it is super important to read the scales correctly! This is also providing us with the chance to practice our subtraction strategies as we work out the difference between our estimations and actual measurements. Last week was all about similes and this week we have learnt about another language feature - metaphors. Maybe you could ask your child what the difference is between a simile and a metaphor and see if they could give you an example of each?
