Dear Parents and Caregivers - Kia ora everyone,

#### Papatūānuku

Kia ora! This week we welcome Riley to our class! It's great being back in the swing of things at school after our Winter Break. We had a circle sharing time on our first day back and I was impressed that the children could confidently talk about at least one holiday highlight, and share that with the class. You may have noticed the Olympic rings in our class! Firstly we had to make them the right colours, so we got into groups, worked as a team, and collaged each ring. They look fabulous! We have been brainstorming what we know about the Olympics and yesterday we came up with questions that we wanted to find out. We have also made a list of sports that we would like to try out ourselves at school. I am impressed that so many children knew a little about the Olympics so far.
